


VISION

PEF believes that education is a universal and fundamental human right. It also maintains that by providing financial help to the aspiring and deserving students, the available human talent can be fully explored and such students can go on to serve the nation with their capabilities.



WHAT WE DO

Professional Education builds a skilled and productive workforce, improves livelihoods, and develops sustainable communities. The PEF mission is directly linked to developing young entrepreneurs and professionals that will help in increasing economic activity across Pakistan.

PEF is currently funding the education costs of 1800 deserving students and provides hostel fees to a selected number of students. At PEF, we give scholarships and financial assistance to the students on Need cum Merit Base. A student, after getting admission on open merit can apply to the universities that are on our Board. We give scholarship fees directly to the university, so a student getting admission has to apply through the student affairs department of the respective university.

After ensuring merit and following a transparent selection process, PEF provides funds directly to the 36 public sector universities across Pakistan for professional education in the fields of Engineering, Medicine, Agriculture, Technology and Management.

PEF monitors the student's progress regularly and keeps in touch with them. It is committed to equal opportunity with no discrimination on the basis of religion, gender, caste, or creed.

A Life Changing Experience

Dr. Zubair Qadir

Sargodha Medical College

Zubair always wanted to become a doctor but his family had always faced financial issues. He had lost his brother due to lack of resources. Zubair's father could not cope with his job because of grief and eventually left it. At one point the family had no income and were surviving on day-to-day basis. Things changed



when Zubair got admission on open merit through PEF at Sargodha Medical College and graduated in 2015.

Zubair says, “It is because of education that I have been able to change my own life, and plan to change more lives by serving the community. I voluntarily provided checkups for 10,000 people in Muzaffargarh, and also plan to establish a welfare maternity hospital in the name of my parents.”

He has now opened a clinical laboratory for deserving people on non-profit basis and has

donated 20 beds for an eye charity hospital where ailments such as cataract and glaucoma are treated and corrective surgery conducted. He has pledged to financially support two deserving students through PEF. Zubair's life has turned around and he has a heart of compassion.

Building The Future

Bilal Raza

NED University, Karachi

Bilal Raza graduated with a degree in Food Engineering from NED University in 2016. His father was a clerk at a company but left due to downsizing and was jobless for 14 years.

To support his family and continue his education, Bilal gave part-time tuitions. His younger brother was a special child and had been bed-ridden since birth. He would get seizures daily due to breathing difficulties and finally breathed his last in 2016.



Bilal got admission at NED University on merit but did not have the resources to continue his studies. He found out that PEF provided scholarships on need-cum-merit basis. His PEF scholarship covered all his educational expenses for four years. This enabled him to concentrate on studies and not worry about expenses.

He is now working in a school where he teaches Physics, Chemistry, and Maths to O-level students. He is earning more than Rs. 50,000 per month, and in the evenings, he studies for his Masters, also under PEF support.

Giving Back To The Community

Dr. Irfan Majeed

Dow University, Karachi

Irfan Majeed is from Ranipur, Sindh. His father was a mechanic with three wives and 13 children. Supporting such a large family was not easy for him. Due to these constraints, Irfan started working at a shop for Rs.20 per day, but his main focus was education.



He wanted to become a doctor. He attained first position in his Matric and 3rd position in the MCAT entrance exam which got him admission in Dow Medical College. The family could not pay the admission fee but someone from the community helped and he started his studies.

Irfan clearly knew that it would take a miracle if he were to continue studying because Dow Medical College was in Karachi and he did not have money to travel or live in the city. During the 4th year at medical school, he learned about PEF. They understood his situation and granted him a full scholarship for 2 years which also included the travel and hostel fee.

Irfan graduated in 2012 and was appointed a medical officer in the Sindh government. He then passed the United States licensing exams and in 2015, started training in Internal Medicine in the USA. Today, he is a practicing physician in the State of Ohio, earning an average salary of \$280,000 - 350,000. He is supporting and giving back to the community, family, and friends.

A Life Transformed

Zain Muhammad

Ayub Medical College, Abbottabad

Zain did his MBBS from Ayub Medical College, Abbottabad. His father passed away in 2005 so his uncle supported the family but he could not continue as he was a farmer and did not earn much.

Zain topped every class till Matric and attained first position in his district. He saw an advertisement about a full FSc scholarship. He appeared in the test and topped in KPK. After doing his FSc, Zain appeared for the entrance test of AMC and got outstanding marks. Since he did not have money to pay for his fees, he fell into depression. He learned about PEF through his university and that they helped

needy and deserving students. Zain applied for a scholarship and soon got the call that would change his life forever.



Today Zain is working in a private hospital and is earning Rs. 75,000.

He is supporting his mother and sisters whom he has encouraged to study and pay their fees.

Struggle To Stability

Zehra Saeed

NED University, Karachi

Zehra Saeed graduated from the NED University in Polymers and Petrochemical Engineering. Her father died in 2002 from heart attack when she was just 11. A strong and bold woman, her

mother's main focus was to educate her children as she is an educated woman herself.

Zehra got admission in NED University but it was not easy for her mother to bear her educational expenses. She applied to PEF and was granted a 4-year scholarship.

Zehra says, "The support that we received from PEF was a great relief to me and my mother. Today I am working as a Technical Support Engineer/Admin Officer/ISO Coordinator at Radiant Chemical (Pvt.) Ltd. I have a good salary package to support my family."



Getting Ahead

Amna Zahid

UET, Lahore

Amna's father passed away when she was doing her Matric. She did not lose hope and scored 940 marks in Matric and she had to get ahead of others. Getting into UET, Lahore on open merit was no less than a dream come true.

She came across many challenges, mainly financial constraints. Sometimes, she felt she



would not be able to continue her education but her relatives helped her by paying her first semester fees. The remaining portion of the fee was still insurmountable, as her family could not support her to get a four-years engineering degree.

Amna came to know about PEF from her department's grant program. She applied for a number of scholarships and was selected by PEF. The financial support enabled her to continue her studies without any worries. She is now working for the company called Urban Unit as a Research Associate. She is earning Rs. 35,000, which enables her to support herself and her mother.

Dream And Reality

Sarah Anwar

NED University, Karachi

Sarah Anwar, the youngest of five siblings, comes from a family with meagre resources. The limited funds available couldn't have helped her in getting education. Sarah passed secondary and intermediate school with flying colours, achieving distinction.

She wanted to be her parents' first engineer daughter but her dreams required financial help. The PEF offered a good scholarship opportunity, based on her merit for the rest of her professional education.



Even in tough times, Sarah continued her education with the help of PEF and the guidance of her mentors. She achieved her dream in 2017 when she graduated from NED University with a degree in Computer Information Engineering. She is now working at Hamdard University as a lecturer and is earning more than Rs. 40,000 to support her family. The dream of her life is a reality.

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

HAFIZ UL HAQ

The key question from every philanthropist is what is the impact of my contribution and how can I measure it. It is here that the Professional Education Foundation (PEF) stands out. The investment in educating an engineer in 4 years is Rs. 280,000, while for a doctor it is Rs 350,000 over 5 years. After graduation, when he/she gets employed, he/she would earn back this entire investment in 8 months. Moreover, his/her family's life will change forever.

We are with you in the business of changing the lives of those deserving students who gained admission in a professional college/university on their own merit, but couldn't pay their next fees for the next four to five years. Through your donations, we pay their full admission fee, education costs and, in some deserving cases, the hostel fees. At the end of the process, we can show that they have transformed themselves into successful individuals who can stand on their own feet and support their families.

Where else would you find a better and a measurable return on investment to society on your donations?

Starting with 75 students in 2009, we have grown and educated 1800 students in 2017-18. Our target for 2018-19 is to educate 2000 students and then grow to 3500 by 2025. More than 673 of the students who have graduated have gone on to the job market.

We operate through 36 major public universities across Pakistan. Most of them have made it to the HEC ratings of top 10 in their field. According to the world's reputed ranking agency, Times Higher Education, London, only 7 Pakistani universities made it to the list of top 1000 universities. You will be pleased to know that 5 out of these are amongst the PEF portfolio of 36 universities.

We pay special attention to our management process, which include all payments being made directly to universities and keeping our donors informed about the progress of their students. We are certified by the Pakistan Centre of Philanthropy (PCP) and I-Care Pakistan awarded us a prize for "distinguished services to humanity" based on our most innovative business model.

Another important feature of the PEF is that although it is a trust, it is managed like a company with the strong discipline of four Board Meetings every year and with active participation of our Board of Governors comprising top businessmen and professionals.

All this has been possible because of your generous and continuous support, for which I and our Board of Governors are deeply grateful to you.

I am thankful to the Board of Governors for taking an active part in fund-raising and in the management of PEF. I am also thankful to the PEF staff who have worked tirelessly in achieving these results over the years.

I look forward to your continued support.




RAHAT FATEH ALI KHAN 'Live in Concert'




